CURRICULUM INTENT STATEMENT

Our Curriculum Vision:

- Ensure our children aspire to be the best that they can be, enabling and building on academic foundations and a love of learning.
- Offer a rich curriculum experience that promotes language development and develops cultural capital in all areas.
- Empower children to have high self-esteem and be learners who are resilient when faced with a challenge.
- Encourage and support children to lead lives that are physical and mentally healthy.
- Enable everyone to be proud of and a part of our school and local community.

Our curriculum covers all of the skills, knowledge and understanding as set out in the ambitious National Curriculum and Early Years Foundation Stage Framework. We enhance this by ensuring that it relates to our locality and the heritage of our pupils. We enrich learning through providing a range of opportunities and experiences that build meaningful and real-life learning. We map the curriculum into a coherent, sequential progression model for each subject that builds cumulatively towards learners being able to use and apply their knowledge, skills and understanding across a range of concepts, making purposeful links, enabling pupils to know more and remember more.

Oracy is woven throughout all curriculum areas, with each subject progression model detailing the oracy expectations for each year group. All learning will begin by revisiting prior knowledge. This will be scaffolded to support children to recall previous learning and make connections. Daily review is used at the beginning of every session to activate prior learning in order for new learning to 'stick' to. New learning is introduced in small meaningful chunks. High quality modelling of language is provided. Teachers support children to practice new learning, questioning for understanding, checking for misconceptions and giving clear and appropriate feedback.

In core subjects, impact is shown through the progress and outcomes of pupils. In addition, pupil voice and the quality of work in pupils' books demonstrates the deeper impact on pupils knowing more and remembering more. In the wider curriculum, pupil voice shows that pupils are confident and able to talk about what they have learnt using subject specific vocabulary. Pupil voice also demonstrates that pupils enjoy and are able to recall their learning over time.

At Girnhill Infant School we work closely with parents and carers to achieve and maintain high standards of attendance. For a child to reach their full educational achievement coming to school every day is essential. We are committed to providing an education of the highest quality for all our children in an environment where all pupils feel welcome and valued. Every child has a right to access the education to which he/she is entitled

As a parent, you have a legal responsibility to ensure that your child:

- Attends school every day and arrives at school on time.
- Contact school before 9:00am on each day of absence if the absence is unavoidable.
- Obtain evidence where possible to support medical/dental/opticians appointment.

As a school we:

- Set high expectations for attendance and regularly monitor.
- Work with parents to encourage regular attendance and punctuality
- Contact you to establish the reason for absence if you have not already provided this (first day response).
- Discuss attendance which is a cause for concern with parents/carers.
- Promote and encourage good attendance via the attendance strategy.
- Conduct attendance checks throughout each half term with EWO

- Polo shirts light blue or white

SCHOOL DINNERS

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals.

Parents/Carers can order online in advance or your child can order their meal after their morning registration.

At Girnhill Infant School our school dinners are cooked fresh on-site by Dolce/School Grid.

If you do pre-order and your child is absent from school please remember to log into your account and delete the order.

At Girnhill Infant School children under the age of 5 (up to the last day of term prior to them turning 5) are entitled to a free carton of milk each school day.

Milk is also free to those children receiving Income Related Free School Meals (not Universal Free School Meals). If you are in receipt of benefits which qualify your child for free school meals please speak to the school office as milk may be free for your child.

As part of the School Milk Scheme, all children are offered the choice of purchasing milk in school (22p/carton). For more information about school milk, including how to register and pay online please speak to the school office.
